### **TIMOTHY BISHOP, Moderator**

At St. Joseph's College New York, Bishop serves as Director of the Center for Community Solutions and Visiting Professor. Bishop serves as Senior Advisor at Envision Strategies, a Washington, D.C.-based government relations firm, and also lectures on how public policy effects access to healthcare.

From 1973 to 2002, Bishop was employed by Southampton College of Long Island University (LIU) in a succession of increasingly responsible administrative positions, including the position of campus provost. In 2002, Bishop left Southampton College to represent New York's 1st congressional district in the U.S. House of Representatives for six terms, serving as a member of the Higher Education and the Education and Workforce committees, as well as the Ranking Democrat of the Water Resources and Environment sub-committee.



### **VICTORIA COLLIVER, Panelist**

Victoria Colliver is POLITICO Pro's California-based health care reporter. Before joining POLITICO, Victoria had been writing about the health industry and medicine for the San Francisco Chronicle since 2001.
