California law prohibits hospitals from using epidural, intravenous or enteral feeding connectors that can fit into connection ports other than the type for which it was intended. Hospitals must transition to the reengineered tubing connectors, which prevent misconnections and facilitate patient safety. Conversion to the new connectors has been met with challenges, making the transition process more difficult.
